

Marc Levine, PhD., was born and grew up in Montreal, and he attended McGill and McMaster Universities in Montreal and Hamilton before moving to Vancouver to attend UBC. Marc's academic experience has been in biology, genetics and pharmacy. After doing administrative and clinical work in adult and geriatric pharmacy and medicine at Shaughnessy Hospital, Marc joined UBC's Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, where he is a professor of clinical pharmacy. He was an associate member of the Department of Pharmacy at Children's and Women's Hospitals, and he is currently Chair of the Research Review Committee of the hospital and the Child and Family Research Institute. This committee is currently being converted to a Clinical Research Ethics Board, in collaboration with the Research Ethics Boards at UBC.

Marc has been a member of the Louis Brier Board of Trustees since June 2001, during which he has also served as a member of the Medical Advisory Committee, Co-Chair (with Sandra Bressler) of the Ethics Committee and, more recently, the Executive Committee. As a member of the Board, Marc's interests have included drug therapy for and clinical care of the elderly, as well as clinical, research and organizational ethics. Marc also recently served as Co-Chair (with Ken Levitt) of the Board's Long Range Planning Task Force, which delivered its final report in the summer of 2008, initiating an implementation process for addressing the needs of Louis Brier for the next 10-20 years.

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
